Ms. Meade made the motion and Dr. Varia seconded the motion to receive/accept the Accreditation External Review Report form AdvancEd.

Board Policy 01.11. the Board shall exercise generally all powers prescribed by law in the administration of the public school system, appoint the Superintendent of schools, create and abolish positions, establish job classifications, and fix the compensation of employees.

ORDER NO. 18314 Property Tax Rates (Item 6-E)

Ms. Meade made the motion and Dr. Varia seconded the motion to adopt Motor Vehicle/Watercraft Property Tax Rate of 55.4 cents per \$100 of Assessed Value for Tax Year 2015.

There was an affirmative vote by all board members present to approve the motion. The motion carried.

KRS 132.487. Per KRS 132.487 all applicable taxing districts that propose to levy a tax on Motor Vehicles valued as of January 1, are required to submit to the Revenue Cabinet on or before October 1 of the year preceding the assessment date, the tax rate to be levied against valuation as of the assessment date. Any district that fails to timely submit the tax rate shall receive the rate in effect for the prior year.

ORDER NO. 18315 Compensating Tax Rate (Item 6-F)

Ms. Meade made the motion and Dr. Varia seconded the motion to approve adoption of the Compensating Tax Rate for Real Property (59.6 cents per \$100 of Assessed Value) and the Compensating Rate for Personal Property (59.6 cents per Hundred of Assessed Value) for the 2014-2015 Tax year.

There was an affirmative vote by all board members present to approve the motion. The motion carried.

KRS 160.470, KRS 157.440, KRS 157.620, KRS 132.0225, 702KAR 3.275. Annually the Board must adopt property tax rates. Collections rates have varied over the years from a high 99% to our current low 87.1%. The normal collection rate generally averages between 93% - 97%. A review of the assessments for the 2015 tax year shows that the total taxable assessment has decreased slightly, therefore the compensating rates available have increased from the rates levied the last year. This means that less taxable property is available to generate the same amount of revenue resulting in a higher cents per hundred rate in FY 2015. It is imperative to levy at least the compensating rate. The rates levied for the 2011 year were less than compensating rates, resulting in a recurring annual loss in revenue of a minimum of \$523,445. The rates levied for FY 2014 were real property 57.9 cents per \$100 and personal property 57.9 cents per \$100. These rates combined to generate \$9,169,841.06 of actual collected revenue. It is recommended that the district, at a minimum levy the compensating rate for FY 2015 which are 59.6 for both the real and personal property.
