BOE Policy 01.11 General Powers and Duties of the Board. The University of the Pikeville University is an accredited University in Pikeville, Kentucky. This year, they are reaching out to Floyd County Schools to place their increasing enrollment of student teachers in our schools. As more students from our area attend UPIke, the desire to place them in surrounding counties has increased. Furthermore, this gives us on the job evaluations of future teachers which will have a positive effect on our recruiting efforts. No cost to the district.

KRS 162.90 Powers and duties of the local board. Regarding the revision to school related student trips there is no anticipated budgetary impact. For the additional employee leave, it is likely allowing emergency leave will create an increase in expenditures for substitute personnel but given the unique nature of circumstances for which the leave can be utilized those costs are expected to be minimal and worth the additional benefit for our employees.

Board Policies 05.21; 05.3; 05.33; 10.3. The Catholic HEART Work Camp has requested the use of BLES and Dome Gym for their volunteer program

in July due to the school's location and accessibility. Catholic HEART Work Camp organization will pay a rental fee to BLES in the amount of \$6,000.00, which includes a \$1,000.00 deposit. These funds will be placed in the school's general funds and used for student achievement and instruction.

BOE 05.3 Community Use of School Facilities and BOE Policy 01.11 General Powers and Duties of the Board. Left Beaver Rescue Squad has developed a partnership with Jimmy Rose from American Got Talent, Coal Keep the Lights On, for a benefit to help raise money to build a new fire station for the Left Beaver Community. The use of the facilities, (Concession stand, restrooms, parking lot, gymnasium and surrounding area, etc...) at South Floyd Middle/High School will be used to host a concert by Jimmy Rose. The event will be on March 23, 2014.

BOE Policy 01.11 General Powers and Duties of the Board. Each year the Kentucky Association for Academic Competition holds the State Governor's Cup Competitions and Awards Banquet for KY High School and Middle School Divisions, Floyd County has the honor of sending six middle grade students to compete at the state level. Three students are from Allen Central Middle, one student from Allen Elementary and two students from Betsy Layne Elementary will advance to state competition. Following the regionals on February 15, 2014 other middle and/or high schools may also be added.

KRS 156.153, Board Policy 9.36, Certified Common Carrier Service, Use of Common Carrier Service shall be authorized by the Board on a case-by-case basis, and the reasons to justify such use shall be cited on the Board Minutes. The cost of this field trip will be covered by fundraiser money and payment made by students.

707 KAR 1:320 Individual Education Program Statutory Authority: KRS 156.070, 156.060, 157.220, and 167.015. Each Admissions and Release Committee (ARC) shall ensure that the length of the instructional/school day for each child or youth with a disability is the same as for children without disabilities except as specified in an Individual Education Plan (IEP). An ARC may determine that the length of the school can be changed for a child or youth if the medical condition (provided by the physician) of the child or youth indicates that the instructional needs to be altered based upon written evidence. The local education agency shall submit requests for shortened school day to the local Board of Education for approval prior to notification to the Kentucky Department of Education. Board action shall be subject to confidentiality requirements. An Admissions and Release Committee at Prestonsburg Elementary School has addressed recommendations involving a shortened school day/week for a student enrolled at this school.
