2010-2011 SFHS CSIP - School Improvement Grant (SIG) Floyd County applied for and received the School Improvement Grant (SIG) for South Floyd High School and Betsy Layne High Schools. The grant application identified an engagement team to be formed at each of the two schools to assist with implementing the plan contained within the grant. The teams includes a Director of Instruction/Engagement Team Lead, two full-time GAP Coaches to share with the two schools; consultants from Kentucky Association of School Administrators (KASA) and Kentucky Association of School Councils (KASC). The grant application contained specific benchmarks to measure student progress. Each school's Comprehensive School Improvement Plan (CSIP) contained strategies to reach the goals set forth in the SIG grant.

It also addresses make-up work that may have been missed. Current policy does not allow students to make up work or receive credit for assignments missed during unexcused absences. The proposed revision will require students to make up work missed due to unexcused absences with a reduced amount of credit given for the assignment (80%). The proposed revision supports "failure is not an Option" and places emphasis on student learning. Two proposed revisions were presented to the principals during the District Instructional Leadership Team (DILT) on May 24, 2011. Discussion was held among the administrators present at the meeting. The motion was made by the principals with consensus to present the attached revision as written to the Board of Education for consideration of approval.

Availability of MCCC staff members has also increased awareness of services available to students (and family members) that may have a need for mental health services. The student has significant physical needs that necessitate special transportation of this type at this time. The parent has been transporting the student for a number of years on a contractual basis to reduce the amount of time the student spends traveling to and from school in order to address significant documented health concerns.

Chairperson of School-Based 504 Meetings (Item 6-K)

Ms. Meade made the motion and Ms. Gearheart seconded the motion to approve the Principal of each school as Chairperson of School-Based 504 Meetings and an Alternate Administrator from each school to serve as Principal's Designee to Chair a 504 meeting.

There was an affirmative vote by all board members present to approve the motion. The motion carried.

Floyd County 504 policies and procedures (KSBA Model). It is recommended that principals chair the majority of, if not all 504 meetings. Designees should chair meetings only when necessary. A chairperson of a 504 meeting must be a representative of Floyd County Schools who is qualified to provide, or supervise the provision of specially designed instruction to meet the unique needs of children with disabilities, and who is knowledgeable about the general education curriculum and the availability of the resources of the Floyd County Schools.

Home Health Care Services (Item 6-L)

Ms. Meade made the motion and Ms. Gearheart seconded the motion to approve contract with Home Health Care Services (of Pikeville, KY) to place trained health care professionals in District to provide total health care (including tracheostomy care) of students for 2011-2012 School Year.

There was an affirmative vote by all board members present to approve the motion. The motion carried.

KRS 160.190 Duties and Powers of the Board and 707 KAR 1:320 Individual Education Program, Section 6. The district has knowledge of several students who will be entering our schools during the 2011-2012 SY requiring health care services in order to receive a free appropriate public education. In order to attend school, students with a tracheostomy must have constant care and attention (i.e., suctioning of tracheostomy; proper administration of oxygen; care of portable tracheal suctioning equipment, ambu bag, oxygen tank and cart; reinsertion of the tracheostomy, if needed; knowledge and care of the Mediport used for IV access; and always being in a position to see the student's face in order to monitor breathing). Initially a Special Needs Para educator underwent training to deliver these services, but ultimately in order to provide a free appropriate public education a medical professional is required to perform duties of this nature.

Central Kentucky Psychological Services (Item 6-M)

Ms. Meade made the motion and Ms. Gearheart seconded the motion to approve limited contract for services with Central Kentucky Psychological Services to meet assessment needs for 2011-2012 School Year.

To ensure evaluation timelines and met in order to meet indicator targets of 100% and additional psychologist is needed throughout the year. The limited contract will allow for the Director of District Wide Services to utilize the services of an additional psychologist to ensure all evaluations are timely.

Relates to 707 KAR 1:320 Individual Education Programs, Section 1 Individual Education Programs and Section 5 Contents of IEP; KAR 1:350 Placement Decisions, Section 1 Placement Decisions (Statutory Authority; KRS 156.070(1), 156.160, 157.220, 157.224, 157.260, 167.015). SIGHTS is a collaborative educational and mental health program designed to provide a therapeutic environment for children whose emotional, social, and educational needs cannot be met in less restrictive settings. The programs' target population includes children whose primary needs are emotional/social in nature. SIGHTS represents the most intensive (day treatment) program currently available to Floyd County students. Only children who demonstrate a clear inability to function successfully in less intensive and restrictive school settings will be considered for admission. Programs are operating at McDowell Elementary School, Renaissance Learning Center, and Adams Middle School.

Audiological-EHDI Branch Agreement (Item 6-O)

Ms. Meade made the motion and Ms. Gearheart seconded the motion to approve agreement between Cabinet for Health and Family Services KY Commission for Children with Special Care Needs Audiological-EDHI Branch and Floyd County Schools.

Relates to KRS 158.440 and 160.290. Agreement was signed at September BOE meeting for audiologist from the Cabinet for Health and Family Services Commission with special health needs to collaborate with the Floyd County Schools to assist students who may be deaf and hard of hearing. The change in the agreement is regarding billing. The original agreement had an attached protocol and fee schedule. This has been changed to "according to the current Commission fee for these services."

707 KAR 1:320 Individual Education Program (Statutory Authority: KRS 156.070, 156.060, 157.220, and 167.015). Each Admission and Release Committee (ARC) shall ensure that the length of the instructional/school day for each child or youth with a disability is the same as for children without disabilities except as specified in an Individual Education Plan (IEP). An ARC may determine that the length of the school day can be changed for a child or youth if the medical condition (provided by the physician) of the child or youth indicates that the instructional needs to be altered based upon written evidence. The local education agency shall submit requests for shortened school day to the local Board of Education for approval prior to notification to the Kentucky Department of Education. Board action shall be subject to confidentiality requirements. An Admission and Release Committee at Prestonsburg High School had addressed recommendations involving a shortened school day for a student at this school.

A temporary Para educator position, would allow for a substitute to work with the student until the school could evaluate the students' needs based upon existing programs and current staff. Sufficient time would be available for the admission and release committee (ARC) to convene and develop an IEP for the student. If it is deemed necessary to have an additional par educator, the Director of District Wide Services would report this need to the board of education and make the recommendation via issue paper as soon as possible.
