CSIP Activity #6 B2, B3 varied classroom instruction to address diversity and enhance student learning. (Students will be exposed to theatrical productions, various types of arts/music and high level learning experiences through field trips, presentations by local and professional presenters, in-house presentations, and virtual tours.)

ORDER NO. 18414 Increase Special Education Staff (Item 6-R)

Ms. Meade made the motion and Ms. Robinson seconded the motion to approve proposal to increase Special Education staff due to enrollment within the Floyd County Public Schools.

KRS 162.90 Powers and Duties of the Local Board of Education. Students have enrolled and have been determined initially eligible for a total of eligible students that is well over what is allowable for a teacher's caseload in regulation at 2 schools. In order to meet the education needs of the students and to comply with Kentucky Administrative Regulations dealing with implementation of Individual Educational Programs and Placement Decisions. The following positions are proposed: .5 LBD teacher Betsy Layne Elementary, 1 LBD teacher at Prestonsburg Elementary.

ORDER NO. 18415 Shortened School Day/Week (Item 6-S)

Ms. Meade made the motion and Ms. Robinson seconded the motion to approve a shortened school day/week for students with special needs.

There was an affirmative vote by all board members present to approve the motion. The motion carried.

707 KAR 1:320 Individual Education Program (Statutory Authority): KRS 156.070, 156.060, 157.220, and 167.015. Each Admissions and Release Committee (ARC) shall ensure that the length of the instructional/school day for each child or youth with a disability is the same as for children without disabilities except as specified in an Individual Education Plan (IEP). An ARC may determine that the length of the school day can be changed for a child or youth if the medical condition (provided by the physician) of a child or youth indicates that the instructional needs to be altered based upon written evidence. The local education agency shall submit requests for shortened school day to the local board of education for approval prior to notification to the Kentucky Department of Education. Board action shall be subject to confidentiality requirements.
